ACADEMIC UPDATES

Turning Struggles into Success: How Students Support Each Other at SIS-Al Bateen

At SIS-Al Bateen, we've introduced a new way to help students who may be struggling academically, and it's all about students supporting students. This year, instead of having special sessions run only by teachers, our academic department has taken a different approach. They've assigned a student in charge of organizing weekly lessons and pairing students who need help with mentors.

Here's how it works: mentors are given something called an AMS 14 sheet. This sheet highlights questions that were poorly answered in the previous week's assessments.

The mentors go over these questions with the students to make sure they understand the concepts they struggled with. It's like having your own personal tutor who knows exactly what you need help with!

Once this part is done, the mentors guide the students through something called the Preplist. Completing the Preplist is super important because it directly contributes to the student's final grades in that subject. It's a great way to practice and make sure you're fully prepared for what's next.



After all the reviewing and preparation, the students move on to the ITL Hall, where they get the chance to retake the exam, they previously failed. It's a second chance to prove themselves and show that hard work really pays off.

This system isn't just about improving grades; it's about building a community where everyone helps each other succeed. It's inspiring to see how mentors and students work together, showing that with teamwork and determination, no challenge is too big to overcome.

We're proud of this initiative and can't wait to see how it continues to help everyone at SIS-Al Bateen shine!

Exploring Opportunities: Optional IGCSE Courses and Opt-Out Exams at SIS-Al Bateen

At SIS-Al Bateen students may choose to take optional IGCSE courses. Starting in 8th grade, students may take these courses, which range from Biology to Business and Math, to prepare for future external exams. Math also give students a head start on the next year's mathematics curriculum without causing any negative influence on the student's average. Biology and Business exams are counted as subjects in the report card of students and may give an extra boost of grades in the final average.

Students also have the option of taking opt-out exams, which include subjects ranging from History to Mathematics and much more. Students must study the course materials on their own and then score a minimum of 90% on the opt-out exam. If successful, this score then becomes the subject score on their end-of-year report card.

Students who successfully opt-out of a course can become an assistant teacher, adopt a failing student or study an additional course on their own.

adds a whole new level of excitement to our STEAM experience.


